

My daughter's best hobby is gardening. She loves planting seeds, watching them grow, and taking care of them every day. She even talks to her plants! Gardening has made her more patient, more observant, and more confident. Emma is only ten, but she understands the importance of nurturing living things. Growing a garden teaches children responsibility, patience, and appreciation for nature. Plants need sunlight, water, and time to grow. They also start noticing details, like the way a leaf changes color or how flowers open during the day.

Lina

Gardening also builds a stronger connection to nature. Children learn where food comes from, how insects help plants, and how seasons affect growth. This makes them more aware of the environment. They begin to respect the earth and become more eco-conscious. I've seen children become more careful about wasting water or throwing litter. Gardening also gives children a sense of calm and focus. When they are surrounded by plants, they tend to feel more relaxed and peaceful. In a world full of screens and noise, the quiet work of gardening can be a great way for children to find balance and peace.

Nora

My son spends a lot of time on his tablet. At first, I thought it was great – he could play games, watch cartoons, and even learn new things. But soon, I noticed that he was spending less time outside, reading books, or even talking to us. He became more distracted, and it was harder for him to focus on simple tasks. I believe too much screen time can affect a child's attention span and reduce the quality of their sleep. When children use screens right before bedtime, their brains stay active, and it becomes harder for them to relax and fall asleep. We now try to limit his screen time, especially in the evening, to help him focus better and sleep well.

Carlos

I agree with Nora. Technology has many benefits, but we must also be careful. One of the main problems I see is that children stop using their imagination. When they watch a video or play a digital game, everything is already created for them. But when they read a book or play outside, they have to invent things and use their creativity. Technology can also reduce physical activity. Instead of riding a bike, climbing trees, or playing sports, many kids just sit with a device in their hands. This can lead to weight gain and low energy. I think it's important to balance screen time with real-world play.

Tamara

Another issue is how technology affects social skills. Many children now prefer texting or playing online games instead of talking face to face. I've seen kids struggle to have real conversations, share toys, or solve small conflicts. They become uncomfortable in social situations because they're not used to them. They may even become more impatient and expect everything to happen instantly, like in a video game. It's important to teach children how to communicate, listen, and be kind. Technology is useful, but it should never replace real human connection.


